

Coffee Sweater



Keep your coffee comfy and cozy with this cup-sized sweater! If you're as caffeine-addicted as I am, you know how important it is to keep your coffee nice and hot, while avoiding burning your fingers. This coffee cup sleeve is super-fast to knit up, and the addition of a few simple cables will keep the attention of even the most caffeine-addled knitters. Since it's a small project worked with worsted-weight yarn, you can make several from a single skein of yarn, making the Coffee Sweater a great pattern for gift knitting.

Materials

Paton's Classic Wool (Grey Mix 00224)

Size 8 Double-pointed needles

1 cable needle (or an extra double-pointed needle)

Tapestry needle

Scissors

Gauge

4.5 sts/inch

Size

One size fits most cups

Instructions

Cast on 36 stitches loosely. Divide the stitches evenly across 3 double-pointed needles (12 stitches on each needle)

Rib Row: [k2, p2, k2, p1, k4, p1] around.

Repeat the Rib Row twice more.

Cable Row: [k2, p2, k2, p1, Cable 4*, p1] around

* "Cable 4": transfer the next two stitches to the cable needle. Bring the cable needle towards you (between your body and your knitting). Knit the next two stitches (still on your knitting needle). Knit the two stitches on your cable needle.

Work Rib Row 6 times

Work Cable Row once

Work Rib Row 6 times

Work Cable Row once

Work Rib Row 3 times

Bind off loosely, weave in ends and lightly block.
